Intent of Seminar:

The intent of this seminar is to develop a regional quality improvement initiative that seeks to ensure that all patients admitted to a hospital for acute coronary syndrome receive evidence-based best practice care as the standard of care.

Objectives

After taking part in this activity, participants should be better able to:

- > Identify and resolve the practice gaps to improve care and survival of the ACS patient;
- > Implement ACC/AHA guideline-based selection, timing and dosing of therapies for both conservative and invasive critical pathways;
- > Apply risk stratification as an integral prerequisite to decision-making in evaluation of patients with possible ACS;
- > Examine the benefits of invasive and pharmacologic treatments for UA/NSTEMI especially among the high-risk;
- > Institute a team approach to STEMI that begins in the field and continues with initial presentation in the Emergency Department;
- > Update critical pathways to include current guidelines-based recommendations for acute and long-term antithrombotic therapy;
- > Implement strategies to reduce time to reperfusion in hospitals without cath labs;
- > Choose the appropriate strategy—early invasive or initial conservative—depending upon risk stratification;
- > Use appropriate bio-markers, ECG findings, and other signs/symptoms to accurately stratify risk in patients presenting with suspected ACS.
